





In Fiscal Year 2018, we exceeded last year's impact by 16%. More than \$117 million covered unreimbursable healthcare costs, high-quality care, and discounted and free services. This graph shows how the \$117 million we provided is distributed back to our communities.



UNPAID COST OF MEDICAID/MEDICARE \$61,193,214

Government programs, including Medicaid and Medicare, provide health coverage for thousands in Southcentral Kentucky. However, these programs don't reimburse hospitals and doctors for the full cost to provide services. We help absorb those costs for patients.

UNPAID DEBT

\$28,371,614

Unpaid debt encompasses services provided in which payment is expected, but isn't received.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE (STATED AT COST) \$7,025,319

Financial assistance is free care provided to the uninsured and people whose incomes meet certain poverty guidelines. This support gives people in our community the care they need without the financial worry.

COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT \$6,651,793

Many resources contribute to helping people get the care they need so they can continue working to provide for their families. We provide social workers as well as a team of professionals to enroll patients in Medicaid. Our financial counselors provide guidance to support and prevent financial challenges. Our Community Clinic and The Dental Clinic offer income-adjusted rates for services provided. We also invest in health fairs, educational classes and screenings to help keep our community healthy.

SUBSIDIZED HEALTH SERVICES \$6,596,274

Often, reimbursements don't cover the full cost of emergency and behavioral care. Med Center Health works to help people heal without the burden of unexpected care costs.

HEALTH PROFESSIONALS EDUCATION \$6,511,857

By investing in educating health professionals, we're investing in the people in our community, healthcare advancements and, ultimately, the overall health of the region. In addition to the completion of the first four-year regional medical school in Kentucky, we offer multiple training programs in our graduate medical education department. We're also providing nursing scholarships to support our next generation of skilled nurses. These investments attract and keep talented healthcare professionals in our community, and elevate the quality of care.

Community growth initiatives are a significant part of our giving. In addition to area Chambers of Commerce and memberships in development organizations, we're listening to the people in our region. Every three years, we conduct a physician manpower study to determine what the community's medical needs are so we can better serve our region.
