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Organizational Description

Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital is a long term acute care hospital located on the sixth floor of The Medical Center at Bowling Green.

The Bowling Green-Warren County Hospital Corporation (the "Corporation"), is a non-stock, nonprofit Kentucky corporation that operates a hospital facility in Bowling Green, Kentucky, under the name "The Medical Center at Bowling Green" and, since October 1996, a hospital and nursing home facility in Scottsville, Kentucky under the name "The Medical Center at Scottsville." The two facilities are part of one corporation but are separately licensed by the State of Kentucky. References herein to "The Medical Center" refer to the combined facilities. References herein to "The Medical Center at Bowling Green" refer to the Corporation's facilities in Bowling Green, Kentucky, and references herein to "The Medical Center at Scottsville" refer to the Corporation's facilities in Scottsville, Kentucky.

The Corporation has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") to be a charitable organization as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and is exempt from federal income taxation by virtue of Sections 501(a) and 501(c)(3) of the Code.

The Corporation is owned and controlled by Commonwealth Health Corporation, Inc., a non-stock, nonprofit Kentucky corporation ("Commonwealth"), under a holding company arrangement, which was established in 1984. Commonwealth has been determined by the IRS to be a charitable organization as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and is exempt from federal income taxation by virtue of Sections 501(a) and 501(c)(3) of the Code.

The Medical Center at Bowling Green was originally founded as the City Hospital in 1926. In 1949, the city hospital became jointly owned by the City of Bowling Green, Kentucky and the County of Warren, Kentucky and was operated by the Bowling Green-Warren County Hospital Commission (the "Commission") as a public hospital. In 1977, the Corporation became the successor to the Commission with a stated purpose of leasing and operating existing Commission facilities and financing, constructing and operating a new hospital facility.



Today, The Medical Center at Bowling Green's buildings include approximately 530,000 square feet and its campus has increased to approximately 56 acres.

Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital

In 2004, Commonwealth Health Corporation opened the doors of Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital. Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital offers residents of the area convenient access to experienced physicians, quality healthcare services and health information.

Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital's purpose is to serve the needs of patients and physicians of the Greater Bowling Green area. It is a Long-Term Acute Care (LTACH), Specialty hospital focused on treating complex, high acuity patients with advanced clinical skills, compassion and sensitivity to the needs of the patient and family. Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital uses a multidisciplinary approach and occupies 28 licensed beds. Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital acts as a "hospital-within-a-hospital" leasing space from The Medical Center. It operates as a separate and distinct entity with its own board of directors, medical staff, and employees.


Service Area Description

The primary service area for Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital is Warren County and the contiguous counties of Allen, Barren, Butler, Edmonson, Logan, and Simpson, which had a population according to the 2010 U.S. Census of approximately 244,900 and an estimated July 1, 2014 population of approximately 282,847. Bowling Green, Kentucky, where the Corporation's major facilities are located is the county seat of Warren County. According to the 2010 U.S. Census, Bowling Green had a population of approximately 58,000 and Warren County had a population of approximately 120,460. Bowling Green has recently been designated a metropolitan statistical area.

Purpose

The Community Health Needs Assessment has been completed for the following reasons:

- To help meet the Hospital's mission to care for people and improved the quality of life in the communities we serve.
- To comply with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 and maintain the Hospital's tax exempt status.
- To establish community health needs for the Hospital's service area, to determine areas of greatest need and for the Hospital to develop a strategic plan to address those needs.
- To involve internal and external resources to ensure needs of individuals are met and that efforts are not duplicated.
- To create a sustainable process for conducting Community Health Needs Assessments that can be continued for future assessments.



Executive Summary

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 included a provision that requires every tax exempt, non-governmental hospital to:

- Conduct a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) at least every three years;
- Adopt a Strategic Implementation Plan that includes how the needs identified in the assessment will be met; and
- Report to the Internal Revenue Service via its 990 tax form how it is meeting its implementation plan.

The Community Health Needs Assessment Report details the process used to collect, disseminate, and prioritize the information in the assessment. Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital worked closely with local healthcare and public health leaders throughout the assessment process.

The end result of the assessment process was the development by the hospital of a strategic plan to address the major needs identified.



Process

In September of 2011, Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital joined with the Barren River District Health Department and numerous other health care providers, community organizations and leaders to form the Barren River Community Health Planning Council. The goal of the Council was to plan and implement a community health needs survey and assessment process followed by identification of key health care needs for the community and then development of strategic plans to meet those needs. The process used was primarily based on the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnership (MAPP). Meetings were held twice monthly for three months and then monthly.

In July 2014, partners began cycle 2 of assessment and planning activities with a focus on the local healthcare system. The priority health issues are Cardiovascular Disease, Diabetes, Obesity, Lung Disease, and Drug Abuse and Addiction. Over the fall and winter 2014-2015 partners voted to rename the council to Barren River Initiative to Get Healthy Together or (BRIGHT) Coalition. Assessment Activities follow the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) framework.

The coalition reviewed evidence- based practices and strategies for improving community health status. They identified gold standard practices and policies that would be found in an ideal situation. The BRIGHT Coalition and the Hospital's strategic implementation plan are based on a few key priority gold standards to help address the needs of the community.



COMMONWEALTH REGIONAL SPECIALTY HOSPITAL IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGIES FOR ADDRESSING COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS

2016 - 2018

Through the research and recommendations from the Community Health Needs Assessment and hospital staff, administration and Board of Directors the following strategies will guide COMMONWEALTH REGIONAL SPECIALTY HOSPITAL leadership in addressing our community's health needs over the next three years.

1. Continue to Strengthen Partnerships With Key Community Health Providers & Organizations

A very beneficial component of the Community Health Needs Assessment process for the hospital was participating as an active member of the Barren River Community Health Planning Council. This reinforced for us the importance of each community health provider in our quest to meet the healthcare needs of all individuals in our community. Over the next three years, Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital will focus on continuing to strengthen relationships with the following organizations and to develop collaborative efforts to improve health care within Warren and surrounding counties. Partnerships may include joint funding of initiatives, providing leadership on governing boards, information sharing and cooperative work on health related grants. This list is not meant to be exclusive and other organizations/providers will be added as identified. In 2012 Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital asked our referring physicians two questions. The first question was in regard to what we could be doing that we were not doing. The consensus was that we need to do more marketing to physicians in surrounding areas. With continual growth of physicians in the BRADD region we feel that this is an area that continues to need focus during the years 2016-2018. We also plan to strengthen partnerships with physicians and referring hospitals by sharing with them our expertise and resources.

The second question was in regard to services that we provide to the elderly population at Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital. One of the services emphasized was the individualized social services plans of care for the elderly population. Our Care Coordination team takes pride in obtaining proper placement for our patients in continuum of care. We have chosen to continue to focus on this area during 2016-2018 but expand for all age populations of our patients. The Care Coordination Department will continue to research resources and build relationships with skilled nursing facilities, Inpatient rehab facilities, assisted living facilities, home health, hospice care and companion care services to ensure our patients are offered the resources that fit their individual needs.

2. Preventative Care & Disease Management Focus

The Community Health Needs Assessment provided data specific to preventative care and disease management. Council members reviewed the data and determined the following focus areas: Diabetes, Obesity, Cardiovascular Disease, Lung Cancer, and Drug Abuse Addiction. Drug Abuse Addiction doesn't apply to the LTACH population at Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital, nor does Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital have programs implemented to support Alcohol and Drug Abuse Addiction. Therefore that topic will not be addressed.

The hospital's overall goal is to educate individuals on the importance of taking ownership of their health and wellbeing.
