Med Center Health Foundation's mission calls us to change lives in our community. Your generosity enables the Foundation to *give back*. As our community needs continually grow, we are able to *meet those needs* with both existing and new programs.

As you will see in this report, the Foundation and the initiatives it supports meets those needs through the operations of the Hospitality House, The Community Clinic and The Dental Clinic, Robert and Mary Tincher Guardian Angel Children's Services Program, Cancer Center and the advancement of education.

In 2024, the Guardian Angel Children's Services Program received a \$1 million donation, the largest cash ever received by the Foundation. This donation renamed the program to Robert and Mary Tincher Guardian Angel Children's Services Program and created the Robert and Mary Tincher Endowment. The endowment's annual distributions will ensure this program will continue their legacy.

Through donations and the Med Center Health employee giving program, a Pediatric Simulator, "Aria," was purchased leading us in the latest technology for pediatric training on site at Med Center Health. This purchase is life changing as we continue to see real life situations with better outcomes each day.

Last year the Charity Ball raised the most ever with \$500,000 supporting the Foundation's initiatives from our generous sponsors and supporters. We continue to grow our Endowments with the establishment of the Paul and Susan Moore Scholarship Endowment with a gift of \$50,000.

We began the Community Champions annual giving society raising more than \$100,000 through pledges and donations. Grants from Delta Dental and WHAS Crusade for Children supported the Clinics and a pledge from Atmos Energy stocked the pantry at the Hospitality House.

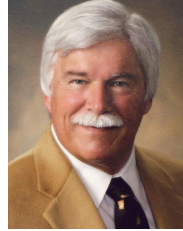

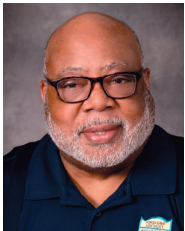

Legacy and Lasting Impact for Children in our Community



The Robert and Mary Tincher Charitable Foundation, Inc. made a donation in the amount of \$1 million to the Foundation in October 2024. With this outstanding commitment to our community, the Guardian Angel Children's Services Program was renamed to the Robert and Mary Tincher Guardian Angel Children's Services Program to help reflect the Tinchers' contributions to benefit children in Southcentral Kentucky. This gift established the Robert and Mary Tincher Endowment and the earnings will be used for costs associated with this program.

The Robert and Mary Tincher Guardian Angel Children's Services Program is designed so no child suffers needlessly due to a basic medical or dental concern their family cannot afford on their own. The mission of the program is to link children's unmet medical and dental needs with charitable resources to reduce, or eliminate, the costs of healthcare.

This endowment will carry out the Tinchers' legacy to ensure children will receive the dental and medical care they need. The Tinchers loved this community and especially children. Their legacy will be carried out for years to come. We are grateful for the Tincher Foundation and their belief in the Foundation.

In 2024, 69 children received dental services from this program. Children ranging from three to 15 were seen, several more than once. We cannot express our gratitude for this program's impact in our community. Helping children with dental and medical care is one of the most profound ways we can shape a brighter future. Good health in childhood lays the foundation for a lifetime of well-being, learning, and opportunity. Every healthy smile and every child free from preventable disease is a testament to the Tincher's legacy.

In honor of this donation and in their memory, a plaque will be displayed in the main lobby of the High Street Tower which will include two floors dedicated to Women's and Children's Services.



Malchow Orthodontics Endowment

Med Center Health Foundation announced the establishment of the Malchow Orthodontic Endowment Fund. The fund, made possible through a \$1 million donation by retired Bowling Green orthodontist Glenn Malchow, DDS, makes available quality orthodontic care



for children of families with financial need residing in Warren and surrounding counties.

The funding provided in this endowment will be used for an entire treatment plan of orthodontic care, including braces, for eligible patients. Med Center Health Foundation, specifically The Dental Clinic, will finalize a negotiated fee that is discounted from typical pricing for treatment plans for most local orthodontists.

Dr. Malchow is a well-known orthodontist from Franklin, Ky., who practiced in Bowling Green for many years. “I have seen the need in our community first-hand,” Dr. Malchow said. “Giving children a good start for their dental care is incredibly important for their overall

health. Bowling Green has been good to me and I want to give back by helping the children who need help the most.”

In 2024, the Malchow Bright Smiles for Life Orthodontics Program kicked off with five children beginning orthodontic treatment at no cost to them. This is an outstanding statement to this community to be able to say the Foundation is a part of such a life-changing service.

We are sincerely grateful for this generous endowment donation that has made it possible for children to receive free orthodontic treatment. This support not only transforms smiles but also gives these children new confidence and hope for the future. Thank you, Dr. Malchow, for making this possible, along with the other orthodontists who partner with the Foundation to provide these services at a discounted cost so we can see more children.



The MCH Cares Program began several years ago as we all witnessed a tornado here in our hometown. As we continued to realize our employees still need support during very trying times, we established the MCH Cares Program.

After enduring dialysis, this surgery marked a new beginning for him, offering hope and renewed strength. The procedure took place at Vanderbilt Hospital in Nashville, TN, requiring a six-week recovery period away from home.

As a PRN in the Laboratory at The Medical Center at Bowling Green, and without PTO or



FMLA benefits, Kiahra faced financial challenges. Fortunately, the MCH Cares Program stepped in to provide much-needed support. This compassionate initiative helped ease the burden of travel, food, and recovery expenses, allowing Kiahra to focus on what truly mattered—her son's healing.

Her husband expresses deep gratitude for the assistance that they received. He shared heartfelt photos of their journey, showcasing the transformative impact of this program. Thanks to MCH Cares, their family can move forward with optimism, knowing they are not alone in this journey.

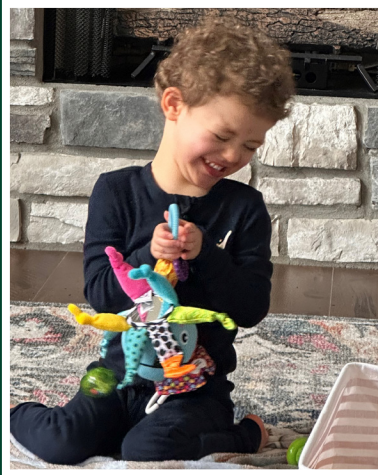


HOSPITALITY HOUSE

Jason Rose

Over the last several years, the Foundation has received donations from Jason Rose and his wife designated for the Hospitality House. Jason is an officer at Pinnacle Bank here in Bowling Green. As we got to know more about Jason, we asked why he gave to the Hospitality House. Here is his story.

In 2019, his grandson was premature which led to his daughter, her husband and his wife staying at the Hospitality House for over a month during a very stressful time in their lives. They live 30 minutes away but that time back and forth was not feasible for the family to be away from their new grandson. "It was a very stressful time for us and we did not know what



outcomes we faced. The affordability of not paying for a hotel, knowing there would be bills to pay truly made a difference for our family as this was one last thing to not worry about. It didn't make sense for my daughter and son-in-law to drive home each day. This took the financial burden of this part away from us," stated Jason.



"It was very important for all of us to stay as close as we could to our grandson. We had a shelter, food, and made friends sharing similar situations during our time at the House. We are very grateful this service is here in Bowling Green. Our donations over the years pay it forward for others to have a great place to stay as we know we are making a difference in their lives with our gifts. The house was a place of refuge and meant more to us than you will ever know. This is our way to help other families in need," said Jason.

After a month at The Medical Center at Bowling Green, their grandson was transported to Norton's Children's Hospital. They stayed at a house similar to this one there also. "We are grateful to have this House here in Bowling Green and know it changes lives each day."

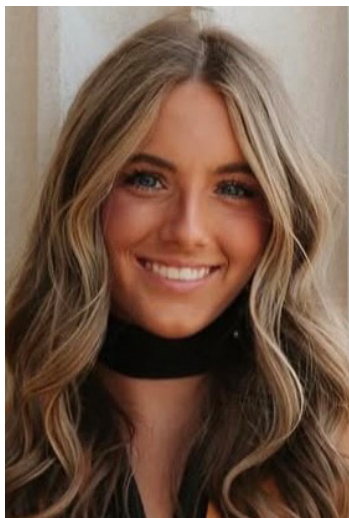

Education Obstetrics Simulator

Through several very generous donations and funds from our employee giving program, "Aria," an Obstetrics Simulator, was purchased. Aria is a birthing mother used on site at The Medical Center at Bowling Green for staff training. Simulators like Aria provide advanced educational opportunities to our providers.

Hospitality House Food Pantry

The food pantry at the Hospitality House was established for families saying at the home to have snacks and quick heat-up meals available during their stay with us. Atmos Energy donated \$15,000 to the Hospitality House "Stock the Pantry" Campaign. This gift will be spent over the next 5-years ensuring the pantry shelves will be stocked. Many other companies, churches and the ECHO committee also continue to ensure the pantry is full for our guests.



GRANTS

Delta Dental of Kentucky Foundation

We were awarded a grant in the amount of \$20,000 from the Delta Dental of Kentucky Foundation in support of The Dental Clinic Access and Equipment Project. This money will be used to purchase equipment and tools that elevate the care we provide to our patients. Our purchase list included a second autoclave, several new hand pieces, additional cavitrons for our hygienists, two additional intro-oral cameras, a second ultrasonic soaking unit and tools. We are very grateful for our partnership with Delta Dental who continues to support us in other indirect ways related to our patients and families.

WHAS Crusade for Children

For the fourth consecutive year, Med Center Health Foundation received funding from WHAS-TV Crusade for Children grant program. A \$19,000 grant was received for the Respiratory Therapy Department for the purchase of a pediatric ventilator that will continue to enhance the care we provide to patients. This device is in place to assist or control breathing in children who have difficulty breathing on their own. We are grateful for their continued support.



Non-Stress Test Room Chair for New Moms

With the support of an anonymous donor, we were able to purchase a chair in the Non-Stress Test Room used by expectant moms during in-office monitoring when needed. This chair helps provide comfort to our moms, as testing times may be lengthy.



Cancer Center and Breast Clinic

The Medical Center Health Hematology & Oncology Breast Clinic received two community donations. Students at Henry Moss Middle School sold t-shirts to raise funds for both the Cancer Center and in support of one of their teachers who had battled cancer. The \$519 they donated to the Cancer center will cover transportation costs for patients who would otherwise be unable to access it.

The second donation for \$100 was received from the Black Student Alliance at Western Kentucky University. Students held a fundraiser in October to support breast cancer patients during National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. The students also wrote notes to our patients that were distributed during their treatment sessions. The messages offered kind words, pictures, and showed support from those who cared.

Festival of Trees Spread Joy

SOKY Ice Rink was decorated with many beautiful holiday-themed trees celebrating the holiday season. Trophies were awarded for most creative, best holiday theme and best in show. The Adult Day Center clients were first in line to ensure their tree was beautifully decorated. The event proceeds in the amount of \$2000 were donated to the Foundation for the Adult Day Center. They have already begun using the funds to purchase guitars and lessons for their clients. This event's theme, "Spreading the Joy" definitely came true!
