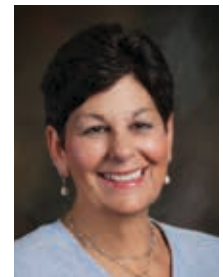

WAYS TO GIVE

Gifts of **any amount** are always appreciated and valued.

Outright Gift: A gift of cash is one of the most convenient ways of giving to the Foundation. Cash can be given in the form of currency, checks, or money orders made payable to Med Center Health Foundation. The Foundation also accepts Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express as a form of payment.

Securities: Gifts of appreciated securities provide considerable advantages to donors. When securities have been held for the required period of time, a donor can deduct the full fair market value of the gift and avoid a capital gains tax on the appreciated amount of the securities.

Charitable Gifts From IRAs: If you are over age 70½, you can direct the Custodian of your IRA to transfer up to \$100,000 of your IRA to Med Center Health Foundation, every year, free of income tax. Any distribution made to Med Center Health Foundation counts toward your required minimum distribution for that year. Because the distribution is not included in your taxable income for that year, the distribution does not give rise to a charitable income tax deduction.

Annual Giving: Individuals commit to an annual giving plan of their choice. These are donors we can count on year after year to support the Foundation's initiatives.

Life Insurance: Gifts of Life Insurance allow donors to make sizable gifts at relatively low cost. By assigning ownership of a life insurance policy to the Foundation, you receive an immediate tax deduction and eliminate the proceeds of the policy from the estate.

Deferred Gifts: Remember the Foundation in your Will. Other avenues might be a Charitable Remainder Trust, Charitable Lead Trust or through your Retirement Plan or Revocable Trust set up for this purpose of giving.

Other: Contributions of real estate or closely held stock are other ways of creating a fund within the Foundation.

COMMUNITY CLINIC AND THE DENTAL CLINIC

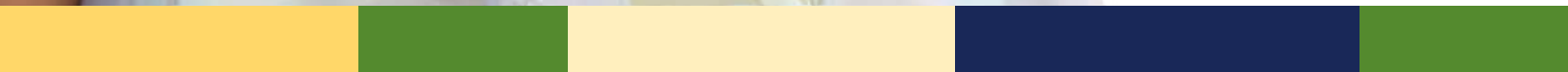
Amy was four years old when she started pre-school. Her limited use of English required language tutoring on a daily basis, and her teachers noticed that Amy winced a lot when she tried to pronounce certain words or make certain sounds. Amy's baby teeth were in very poor and painful condition. When Amy was seen by a local dentist's office, it was suggested that crowning almost all of Amy's teeth might buy her the additional years of time needed until her adult teeth could grow in. Unfortunately, Amy was uninsured and the cost of the services needed were far outside of her family's financial means.

Guardian Angel Children's Services was able to work with a charitable network of providers to connect the dots, bringing together the dentist, translation services, the supplies and the proper financial resources to get everything in the same place, at the same time.

Today Amy is an energetic young lady whose language skills are almost equal to those of her classmates. Because of the generosity of people who cared to give of their time, talents and financial resources, Amy received the help she needed.

The Guardian Angel Children's Services program provides medical and dental care to children who desperately need help.

HOSPITALITY HOUSE – A Home for Many

In 2015, when Joel and Dennette Johnston's son Jay suffered a severe health incident and was told he needed a long-term, acute-care hospital, they were confused and frightened. As a physician, Dr. Johnston reviewed available options for care closest to their home near Owensboro, and chose Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital, located within The Medical Center at Bowling Green, as their best option.

On a ventilator and paralyzed, Jay was transported with his parents at his side. Dennette remembers they arrived in Bowling Green not sure about where they would stay, or for how long they would be here.

"As we walked off the elevator on the floor of Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital," Dr. Johnston recalled, "we saw the Hospitality House poster. It was as if all the needed resources just came together for us. The fact that there was no charge to stay there absolutely blew us away."

Over the next six months, Joel and Dennette called the Hospitality House their home. Being only a few hundred feet away from where their son was being cared for provided a sense of convenience and security for both parents and son until he was able to return home.

Now in its seventh year of operation, there are hundreds of Hospitality House stories just like this



one. The Hospitality House provides lodging for guests during cancer treatments, for mothers whose babies must remain in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, and for other family members of patients being treated at The Medical Center or Commonwealth Regional Specialty Hospital. The Hospitality House has approximately \$250,000 in annual operational costs. There is no charge to stay at the Hospitality House; however, guest donations cover a small portion of this cost.

The Hospitality House Endowment Campaign is underway as we work to grow the endowment by \$2 million enabling more patients and families to have access to the respite or support the House provides. A donation to the endowment is an investment for the perpetuity of the home.

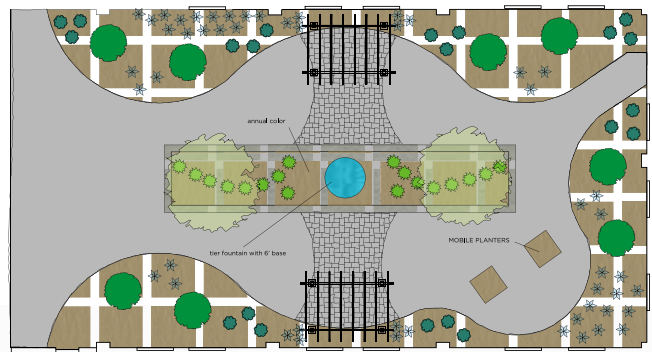

- **More than 1,000 medical patients** have been seen for physicals, high cholesterol, hypertension, thyroid disease, upper respiratory infection, colds, flu and other general services
- **2,200 dental patients** received basic care to include annual cleanings, denture replacement, extractions and fillings
- **13,000 total services** provided (labs, office visits, consults, education sessions and referrals)
- **3,000 prescriptions** to patients at no cost
