


WORKING WITH US

STUDENT NURSE EXTERN I (SNE I)

Qualifications: Actively enrolled in a board-approved pre-licensure program of nursing, and have completed their first semester.

Requirements: Students will have the option to work 4, 8 or 12 hour shifts on days or nights. A minimum of 24 hours per 6-week schedule will be required.

Duties: Patient Care Assistant responsibilities, blood glucose measurement, insertion/removal of indwelling foley catheters, removal of peripheral IV insertion.

STUDENT NURSE EXTERN II (SNE II)

Qualifications: Actively enrolled in a board-approved pre-licensure program of nursing, and have completed their third semester.

Requirements: Work for 6 months as a SNE I. May work up to a maximum of 24 hours in a two-week pay period as a preceptee with a licensed nurse who is a trained preceptor. SNE II students may work additional non-precepted hours as desired as an SNE I.

Duties: Patient Care Assistant responsibilities, all Tier 1 designated skills, medication administration, PO, IV, IM, SQ, PR, SL and EMAR documentation.

RN APPLICANT (RNA)

Once you complete your nursing program, you are eligible for the Graduate Nurse Residency Program to transition from the classroom to bedside nursing.

Qualifications: Graduate of a school of nursing and Provisional License from the Kentucky Board of Nursing required.

Requirements: Full-time position

Duties: the RNA functions under the direct supervision of an RN and does not engage in independent nurse responsibilities. Performs functions delegated by the RN preceptor while being continuously supervised.

GRADUATE NURSE RESIDENCY PROGRAM
