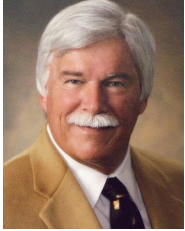

Guests don't know they need a Hospitality House until they are dealing with maybe the most challenging moments of their or their loved one's life ... and then, suddenly, without warning, they need a parachute. The more I thought about it, the more I realized that many of the initiatives funded and supported by Med Center Health Foundation are like parachutes; you don't know about them until you need them.

As you will see in this report, the Foundation and the initiatives it supports provided comfort, care, and respite to a number of patients, visitors, and guests in 2023. Of particular note, because of the generosity of donors like you, the Foundation was able to help The Medical Center at Bowling Green purchase a third GE Healthcare Giraffe™ Incubator Carestation for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), helping the tiniest of patients and their families receive the best healthcare in Southcentral Kentucky. And because of our continued relationship with the Tinchier Foundation and WHAS Crusade for Children, we are able to provide health and dental care to children whose families otherwise couldn't afford it, and provide a more inclusive clinic and hospital environment for special needs children.

KEEPING NEWBORNS AND PARENTS CLOSE

When India and Darren Blankenship found out they were expecting their first baby, they knew the pregnancy would not be an easy one. India's physician prepared the couple for several scenarios — including a premature birth, which is exactly what happened.

Maverick Lee Blankenship made his appearance at just seven months, weighing a little over three lbs. Because he was a preemie, Mav stayed in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) for 25 days. The Blankenships live in Allen County, KY (nearly 45 minutes from The Medical Center at Bowling Green). Not wanting to be that far away from their newborn, India and Darren found their way to the Hospitality House on The Medical Center's campus where they were now a short 5-minute walk away from the NICU and Baby Mav.

"That first night I was away from my baby, it was the hardest time of my life," says India. "I just cried and cried."

Darren adds, "it was the most helpless feeling."

But because of the generosity shown by the Hospitality House staff and guests, each day got a little easier. India and Darren could walk over to the hospital at any time, day or night, to feed and hold Mav. While they would have much rather have been able to take their baby home right away, their time at the Hospitality House made this scary time a little more bearable.

India said, "The people at the Hospitality House became our family. They asked about Mav everyday and celebrated each little victory with us!"

Darren said it best when he asked, "What would we have done without the Hospitality House?"



CARING FOR OUR TINIEST PATIENTS

In 2023, due to the generosity of donors and Med Center Health employees, Med Center Health Foundation was able to raise funds for a third GE Healthcare Giraffe™ Incubator Carestation for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). As Bowling Green continues to grow, the need for NICU care continues to grow, too.

Recently, the NICU department expanded from 12 beds to 16 beds. With that, the need for more isolettes for the tiniest of patients also increased. In addition to the two Giraffe Incubator Carestations purchased in 2022, the Foundation was honored to partner with the NICU to help the department grow.

"The Foundation continues to be a great partner to the NICU. We are grateful for their willingness to fundraise and help us provide the best care to our patients and their families," says Kim Dethridge, RN, Director of Women's Services at The Medical Center at Bowling Green.

WHAS CRUSADE FOR CHILDREN GRANT FUNDS PEDIATRIC EQUIPMENT

For the third consecutive year, Med Center Health Foundation received funding from the WHAS-TV Crusade for Children grant program. In 2023, WHAS awarded Med Center Health Foundation \$5,000 to purchase specialized pediatric equipment. The grant was specifically used to purchase a transcutaneous jaundice meter, pulse oximeter, Bilirubin bed, and a phototherapy radiometer.

THE COMMUNITY & DENTAL CLINICS

The Community Clinic and The Dental Clinic were established to meet the medical and dental needs of our community for those who cannot afford these services on their own.

THE COMMUNITY CLINIC

- 108 medical patients
- 105 lab visits
- 347 referrals for specialty consults, imaging diagnostics, mammograms and colonoscopies
- Partnership with our Med Center Health WorkLife program provided services for more than 12 client's patients for basic care during their first 90-day waiting period
- 90 patients were seen for diabetes counseling

THE DENTAL CLINIC

- Dr. Kathleen Donley was hired as a part-time dentist
- More than 2,800 patients were seen for dental services
- 50 sets of dentures were provided to our patients

MCH CARES HELPS EMPLOYEE WITH LONG- DISTANCE CARE OF MOTHER

Many of us know how stressful it can be when a family member is diagnosed with cancer. For Winnie Beckman who works at The Medical Center in Environmental Services, the stress was even greater — her mother was diagnosed with stage IV breast cancer, all while living miles away in the Philippines. Winnie found herself trying to keep up with her mother's health, as well as figuring out how to pay her medical bills.

"I was drowning in bills," Winnie said. "It's hard because I am the only one who can help. There were hospital visits, medications, chemotherapy and she needed a blood transfusion." A nurse helped Winnie understand what was going on with her mother, and also told her about MCH Cares — a program designed to help Med Center Health employees in times of hardship. Jonathan Phelps, Director of Linen/Environmental Services, helped Winnie apply for aid. Soon after, Winnie received much-needed money thanks to the generosity of Med Center Health employees.

"I am so thankful for MCH Cares," Winnie said, "and so happy that, with chemo, there is more life for my mother."

The MCH Cares program gives Med Center Health employees an easy opportunity to help their fellow employees through payroll deduction. One hundred percent of what is donated is used for employees who need help during trying times. Learn more at MCHealth.Foundation/MCHCares.

EMPLOYEES CONTRIBUTING TO HELP OTHERS (ECHO)

ECHO has been a huge part of The Medical Center community since 2000 when the Foundation began. At that time, 345 employees donated through payroll deduction with a total raised of \$16,525 annually. As we ended 2023, 945 employees were enrolled in ECHO. In CY23, \$195,510 was raised through payroll donations. To date, \$2.9 million has been given back to patients, their families, and our own employees when help has been needed.

This statement shows the value of the ECHO program and what difference it makes in lives in our community. We are very grateful for everyone who has given a gift over the years. 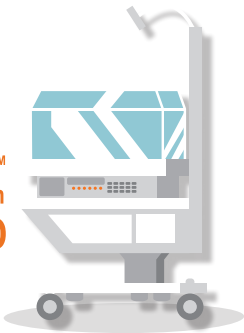
